

# Hoggets’ Roam

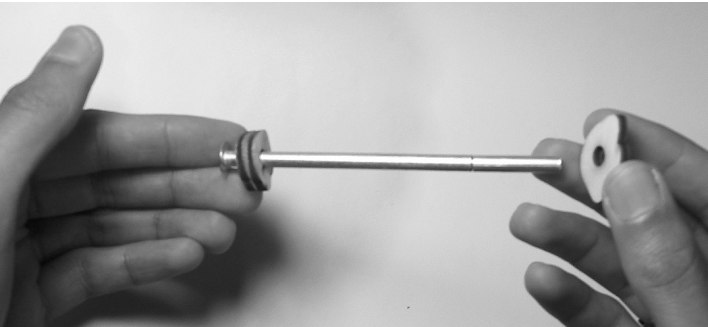

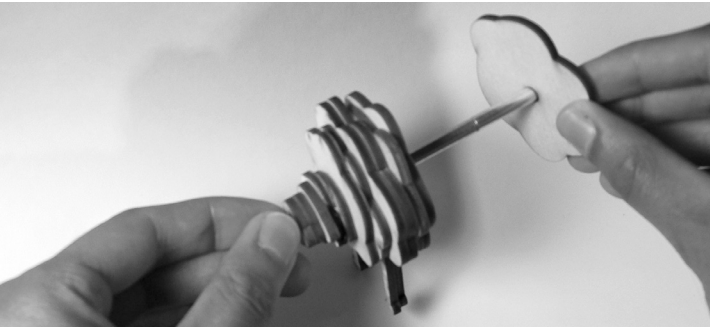
A limited-edition artist series, each individual Hogget is made from laser cut birch plywood and/or wool felt.



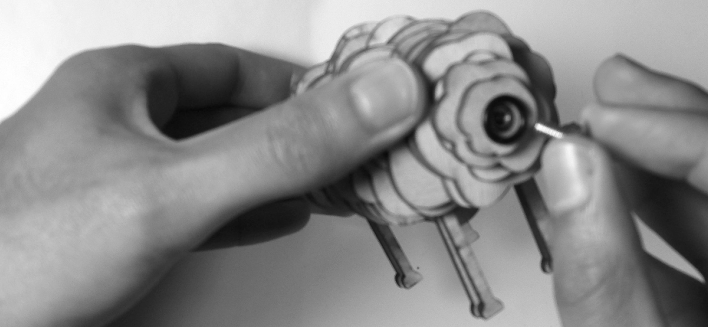
## How to Assemble Your Hogget



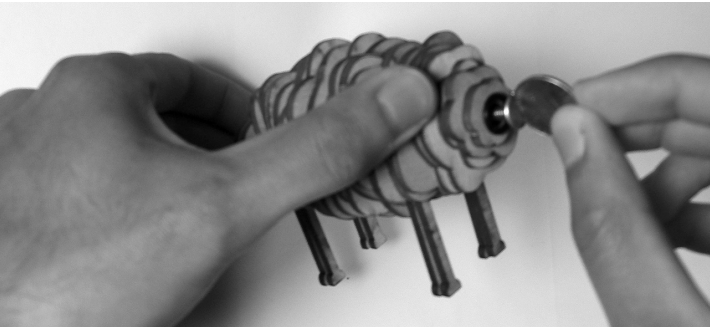
1. After removing the pieces from the panel, slide each piece onto the aluminum bolt. Refer to the back of this page for the assembly order.



2. Continue adding pieces until your Hogget is complete.



3. Place the small black rubber gasket over the tail end of the Hogget and then insert the aluminum screw.



4. Using a penny or screwdriver, tighten the screw until it is snug. Be careful not to over tighten or you may move the gasket out of place.

After you have signed in, follow these steps to join the “hoggets roam” group on flickr.

1. Click on the groups tab in your home page.
2. Search for the group “hoggets.”
